DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Rules, definitions and judging procedure as prescribed in the latest edition of the Official Show Rules and the Standard of Perfection of the American Poultry Association, Inc., shall apply to the Monterey County Fair poultry show except in such instances where they are in conflict with the rules and regulations prescribed by the State and Local Rules listed in this Entry Guide Book.
- The management will do ALL feeding.
- Birds will be shown and judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age and sex only. If no class is offered, no awards may be made.
- The Monterey County Fair remains committed to hosting a quality poultry exhibition. Health checks are mandated by the Division of Fairs & Expositions and will be performed by certified Poultry Health Inspectors (PHI) from one of the designated CDFA/UC Certification Programs. The PHI will evaluate the health and condition of every bird entered. As a result, coop in times may be delayed. Look for signs when you enter the Fairgrounds as to where to take your bird(s) for the examination- do not proceed to the poultry barn until your bird(s) have been examined. Please make sure you carefully examine each bird before you leave home and follow your regular cleaning procedures. Any birds that show signs of illness, stress, or are not in top quality condition will not be allowed to enter the show. Birds with wing feathers or any other feathers that have been clipped or trimmed will be disqualified.
- For all classes of Standard-Bred chicken and ducks, all birds must be identified by leg bands or wing bands conforming with the entry form on arrival at the show. The Entry Office must be notified of any changes before 5:00 p.m. Wednesday, August 12, 2009. No changes will be made on the day of judging, Thursday, August 13, 2009.
- Substitutions can only be made within a division.
- No birds or supplies, for any reason other than sickness of entry, will be released before Sunday, August 16, 2009.
- It is not mandatory that a first place award be given if there is no entry in the class, or division worthy of such placing.
- All birds are entered at the owner's risk. The Fairgrounds and its management are not responsible for any thefts or injuries that may occur to the birds.
- If a division does not have at least 10 entries, it may be combined with another division and judged as one.
- All entries must be checked by Show Superintendent before cooping in.
- If there are more than 10 entries of the same breed a separate division will be created and judged.
- NOTE: After entries are closed, they will be screened down to the number the Fair can provide housing for.
- Definitions of Classes:
COCK OR OLD DRAKE - Male 1 year or older
HEN OR OLD DUCK - Female 1 year or older
COCKEREL OR YOUNG DRAKE - Male under 1 year
PULLET OR YOUNG DUCK - Female under 1 year
- Pre-entry for Showmanship is Mandatory.
- Primary Level: Must be 5 years old or in kindergarten as of January 1, 2009 to exhibit at Fair. Primary membership ends when members qualify as junior members. Exhibitors who are under 9 years of age as of January 1, 2009 are not eligible to compete in large animal competitions at California Fairs.
- All Monterey County 4-H, FFA, and Independent Livestock Exhibitors at the Monterey County Fair MUST enter at least one (1) non-livestock project for exhibit in the 4-H, FFA Divisions in the junior Buildings at this year's annual Fair. All non-livestock projects must be entered & delivered on their specific dates. NO LIVESTOCK PROJECTS WILL BE ACCEPTED IF THIS ABOVE RULE IS NOT MET. ANIMALS WILL BE SENT HOME. NO EXCEPTIONS. All other rules stated in the premium book apply. This does not apply to San Benito & Santa Cruz County exhibitors.
- IMPORTANT - ALL Auction checks will be held ten days after close of Fair. With the exception of any animal found to have residues in tissues of carcass. Checks will be PICKED UP at the Fair Administration Office by the club/chapter's COMMUNITY LEADER or FFA ADVISOR (The Fair Office must have that person's name on their Leader and Advisor List) ten days after close of Fair, Friday, August 28, 2009. ALL JLA & Trophy Sponsor Thank You notes must be turned in on Sunday, August 16, 2009 between 3:00 pm and 5:00 pm at the Auction Ring. All Auction Thanks You notes must have been turned in to receive checks. All premium and auction checks must be cashed within 90 days; there will be a replacement fee of \$25 plus bank fees for each check. The Monterey County Fair Junior Livestock Auction Committee discourages exhibitors from giving alcohol as a buyers' gift..

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Entry deadline is July 20, 2009. Placement of Posters must be completed and displayed by **Tuesday, August 11, 2009 by 6:00 p.m.** All entries **MUST** have an entry identification tag clipped to the **bottom right corner of display.** Entry tags can be picked up at the **Little Livestock Office on Tuesday, August 11, 2009.**
2. Individual Exhibitors may enter an educational display for each class. The Danish system of judging will be used.
3. Displays must be designed, constructed and installed by exhibitors.
4. A space 22" x 28" will be provided. Poster boards must not exceed 22" x 28". Limit two entries per class, with information on ONE side only. Information on poster board can be made from any medium. For example: die cuts, photographs, magazine clippings, essays, pictures, etc. Posters may display photos of breed, descriptions of egg projects, physical attributes of poultry, history of poultry breed, variety of breeds, gestation cycles, etc. **BE CREATIVE AND EDUCATE THE PUBLIC!**
5. All combustible materials must be fire retardant.

1. This division is designed to encourage youth to expand their knowledge of avian facts and become proficient in poultry management and related subjects. Contestants will be required to answer a variety of written and/or verbal avian questions in a

timely manner with judges present. Questions *may* include topics such as avian systems; breeds, varieties and strains; game birds; embryology; eggyclopedia, and additional facts.

2. A study guide and rules will be available after May 1st by sending a self addressed, stamped envelope (letter size envelope, 1st class stamp) to the Monterey County Fair, 2004 Fairground Road, Monterey, CA 93940.
3. Avian Bowl will be on Thursday, August 13, 2009 following Showmanship at the Poultry Barn. Entrants may pre-enter or enter on site by 9:00 a.m.

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Entries limited to exhibitors located in Monterey, Santa Cruz, and San Benito Counties ONLY. See Jr. Livestock Rules and Regulation, Rule 14.
2. Limit two (2) meat pens per exhibitor. A meet pen shall consist of two (2) broilers. No extra meat birds will be allowed onto the Fairgrounds to be added to a pen if original pen does not make weight. Absolutely no re-weighs.
3. The Junior Poultry Market Broilers Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion and 1st place Weight Champion (no more than 3 lots) selected by the judge will be sold during the Jr. Livestock Auction. The Fair will supply pens; however it will be the exhibitors' responsibility to care for and feed the birds.

1. Pre-Entry for Showmanship is Mandatory. (Highest placing 4-H Junior, 4-H Senior, FFA Novice & FFA Senior winners will advance to Round Robin Competition. (Round Robin – ONLY 4-H and FFA exhibitors from Monterey, Santa Cruz & San Benito Counties are eligible)

** Top three winners of each class may progress and compete only if there is a showmanship class offered. **Top 3 novices go to the Junior Final and top 3 juniors go into the Senior Final.**

CLASS:

1. **4-H NOVICE** - Exhibitor must have never shown this species of animal in a showmanship class at any Fair. Exhibitor must be 9 - 11 years of age and have never shown this specie.
2. **4-H JUNIOR** - Exhibitor who is 9 - 13 years of age who have shown this species of animal at the Fair and for exhibitors 12 - 13 years of age who have never shown this species of animal at any Fair.
3. **4-H SENIOR** - Exhibitors age 14 - 19 years of age who have previously shown this species of animal in showmanship and including exhibitors 14 - 19 years of age who have never shown this species of animal in showmanship.
4. **FFA NOVICE** - Exhibitor must have never shown this species of animal in a showmanship class at any Fair
5. **FFA SENIOR** - Exhibitor must have shown this species of animal at any previous Fair.
